

HOW TO MAKE QUILTS

If you have never made a quilt before, choose a simple pattern. Some of the old and extremely simple patterns are among the most beautiful and popular. If it is to be a pieced quilt, choose a pattern that has straight edges; curves are more difficult to fit together. Blocks are easier to handle than an allover design. If you wish to make an appliqued quilt, select one that has few, and rather large, appliqued piecess.

All pieces should be accurately cut. From your quilt pattern cut a master pattern of each piece, using sandpaper or blotting paper. Either is satisfactory as it will not slip when laid on the material. Do not cut off the seam allowance when making your pattern. Trace lightly on the material around the master pattern. Use a sharp pencil and slant the pencil end away from the pattern so the pencil point is close to

the pattern when tracing. Trace a number of pieces at one time; then cut them out, cutting exactly on the pencil line. Stack pieces of the same kind together. Lay stacks of A, B, C, etc., pieces in a shallow box where they can be easily reached when sewing.

Quilts should be securely sewed because of the strain on them in quilting. Use No. 40 to No. 60 thread and fine needles. Make a back stitch at beginning of seam, sew with short running stitches (about 1/16"), and take several back stitches at the end to fasten seam. Seams are turned to one side rather than pressed open. When you begin to piece, check your work with pattern to be sure your seams are the correct width. In joining strips in which there are crosswise seams, match the seams with pins before sewing. When sewing across a seam, take a back stitch at the seam joining. For an appliqued quilt, cut two sets of master patterns, cutting the seam allowance off one set. This set will be used in turning under the seam allowance by pressing the edge. Lay each piece wrong side up, center the pressing pattern on it, and with a warm iron press the seam allowance over the pattern. If an edge is very circular, run a basting thread and pull it up, gathering the edge to fit the pressing pattern.


Keep the work flat while basting the applique. A card table is handy to work on. Place the pieces in the correct position on the background and baste. Use thread of a contrasting color for basting so it will be easy to remove later. Blind stitch the appliqued pieces to the foundation, using mercerized thread of the same color as the appliqued and a short, fine needle. Clip the basting threads every few stitches and remove carefully.


One full block and corner of quilt with 3" border is shown in sketch.


Cut pieces -- the number and color given with patterns. Set 5 blocks across and 6 up and down. Sew 8 "B" pieces to "A" pieces, 8 "C" pieces fit between points of "B" pieces. Make 4 squares and

4 triangles of squares and small triangles, join to "C" piece as illustrated in sketch.

Line and pad quilt well. Quilt around seams and as shown for border. Bind in color. Finished quilt with 3" border measures about 96" x 114". Quilt top requires about 5 yards of print, 2 yards of dark blue, 2 1/3 yards of med. blue, 3 1/8 yards of light blue and 4 yards of white.







TREE OF PARADISE

The block of the Tree of Paradise is $17\frac{1}{2}$ inches square and should be set diagonally in the quilt. When all pieced blocks are used, ll will be required. Eight of them will be set as whole blocks, 3 cut in halves diagonally. These halves are to be used to fill out the sides and white will be needed for the corners of your quilt. If you prefer, you may alternate the block with plain white squares and in that case, the cutting will come on the plain blocks.

With the addition of a 12inch border, or a double border-6 inches wide for each of two
colors, the quilt will measure
72x96.

TO PIECE THE BLOCK: Make all seams 1/4 inch as indicated. Build up three rows of "B" and "C" triangles as in the sketch. Make two of these sections, reversing the order, for the two sides of the tree. Make a center section of "A" squares and "B" triangles. Assemble the pieces for the trunk and body of the tree--"D", "E", "F", "G" and "H" as indicated. The two "F" pieces are applied to the corners of the "E" pieces as an overlay. Now set on the leaf sections of the tree and your block is finished.














EIGHT DIAMONDS AND A STAR (con't)


A-yellow or pink--2 1/3 yds.


To piece the block:


Sew 8 pieces of B together, small ends toward center. Join these to the center, E. Sew 8 each of C and D together as shown in illustration. Join the blue and white border around D section. Add the 4 corners, A. Sew blocks in strips of 10 or 11 and join strips for quilt top.

Fold borders in half so pieces measure 4" wide. Miter corners of border then sew to quilt.


Various other color schemes could be used as well as the one suggested above.







RADIANT STAR





Strips of color 2½x12½-inch and squares of white set together this lovely star block, which is best made of a plain color and white. You will need a double 3-inch border, 30 pieced blocks, 49 strips and

20 squares to make a quit 80x94. This will require about 3½ yards of white, and 6% yards of color. Make the points of the star first, setting the white and colored triangles into squares and then into

strips. Add D before joining to the C pieces. Then join sections already made to the Bs around cent-er A. Fill in with squares and triangles.








The feather circle design in 6-inch size fits well into the white of the Snowball as well as between the flowers of the String of Beads, also called Poinsettia.


A 12-inch square should be folded cornerwise and straight to divide it for the applique. The 4 center petals are tiny prints. Then green, shown as black--then two petals of pink, or the color you wish to accentuate, and in the corner, prints again. The same effect is produced where the blocks join, and green is added to cover the seams.
